WHAT IS SCHOOL READINESS?

Florida's School Readiness
Program (SR) offers financial
assistance to help children age
0-12 from low- income families
receive high-quality child care so
parents can work or participate in
job training.

The program takes into account a child's physical, social, emotional and intellectual development and provides resources and assistance to families.

Parents can choose from private centers, public schools, and family childcare homes.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Parent(s)/guardians(s) must be working or participating in an educational activity, such as attending college or trade school at least 20 hours per week.
- Gross income must be at or below 150% of federal poverty level for family size.
- Families must pay a copayment for child care based on income and family size.



¿QUÉ ES SCHOOL READINESS?

El Programa de Preparación Escolar ("School Readiness") de

Florida ofrece asistencia financiera para ayudar a los niños de familias de bajos ingresos a recibir cuidado infantil de alta calidad para que los padres puedan trabajar o participar en capacitación laboral.

El programa tiene en cuenta el desarrollo físico, social, emocional e intelectual del niño y proporciona recursos y asistencia a las familias. Los padres pueden elegir entre centros privados, escuelas públicas y hogares de cuidado infantil familiar.

REQUISITOS DE ELEGIBILIDAD

- Los padres/tutores deben estar trabajando o participando en una actividad educativa, como asistir a la universidad o escuela de oficios, al menos 20 horas por semana.
- El ingreso bruto debe ser igual o inferior al 150 % del nivel federal de pobreza para el tamaño de la familia.
- Las familias deben pagar un copago por el cuidado de niños según los ingresos y el tamaño de la familia.

Child Care Assistance for ALICE Population

Funding from Children's Services Council Leon County (CSC) has allowed the Early Learning Coalition of the Big Bend Region, Inc. (ELC) to expand eligibility for Florida's **School Readiness Program** (SR). Now, even more families can receive financial assistance to help their children aged 0-12 receive quality child care while caregivers work, attend school, or participate in job training.

Families can choose from private centers, public schools, and family child care homes.

Eligibility Requirements

- Parent(s)/guardians(s) must be working at least 20 hours per week or participating in an educational activity, such as attending college or trade school.
- Gross income must be at or below 200% of federal poverty level for family size.
- Families must pay a copayment for child care based on income and family size.

ELIGIBILITY

Children must live in Florida and be 4 years old on or before Sept. 1 of the current year to be eligible. If their birthday falls from Feb. 2 through Sept. 1, you may wait to enroll your child the following year when they're 5.

HOW TO APPLY

You can apply online from a computer or mobile phone by visiting

familyservices.floridaearlylearning.com

You will need:

- an email address
- proof of Florida residency
- proof of your child's age

Your local early learning coalition will review your application and email you with further instructions. Once your application is approved, the coalition will provide you with a Certificate of Eligibility you can take to any VPK provider. **Questions?** Call us at **(850) 385-0504.**
